My photography is about my presence in the urban space, marks and traces of my drifting mind and citywalking.

Photography is momentary, the articulation of my here-and-now, being there doing. Every photograph, therefore, is a projectile, a forward motion, or else, snatches from the boundless ocean of chaos.

BIOGRAPHY

Linda (Chiu-han) Lai is a Ph.D. in Cinema Studies (NYU), currently Associate Professor at the City University of Hong Kong's School of Creative Media, and Leader of Critical Intermedia Arts. She has been a writer and independent curator for contemporary media art, and an active symposium speaker.

As an artist, Lai is trans-disciplinary. Her works have a strong concern for language and micro/metanarrativity, grounded in a feminist sensibility that integrates critical theory, cultural studies, and historywriting. Her works are also largely auto-ethnographic and engage in found footage and compilation.

Her video art, installation and digital works have been shown in funded exhibitions in Hong Kong and in art and film/video festivals in Paris, Berlin, Oberhausen, Hamburg, Birmingham, Barcelona, Jihlava (the Czech Republic), Seoul, New Delhi, Kuala Lumpur, Kaohsiung, Montreal, and numerous experimental film/video festivals in the United States. Her photographic works have been strongly influenced by her practice and knowledge in cinema and seek inventive synthesis between still images and digital video. Her photograph works are also closely tied to her practice as a city-ethnographer.

Lai is the founder and currently Artistic Director of the Writing Machine Collective (WMC) (2004 to present). [go to -> <u>WMC</u>] After co-founding Experimenta and creating the space's first-year art portfolio, she quit and founded a new group, the Floating Projects Collective (FPC), an art incubator for emerging artists as well as artistic/curatorial experiments for experienced artists and theorists. [go to -> <u>FPC</u>] She was also member of the Board of Directors for the Para/site Art Space (2003-2009).

Among various academic and art writings, she has published a +280-page photo-text dialogue with Theresa Junko Mikuriya, partially supported by the Philippe Charriol Foundation, titled *Cryptoglyph: Dialogues in Many Tongues in the Hidden Crevices of an Open City* (2004). The book documented their 8-round photo-text games, exploring the artistic inscription of two women's subjectivities in the city space of the contemporary world. She also researched and edited the 334-page [Re]-fabrication: Choi Yan-chi's 30 Years, the paths for interdisciplinary in art (1975-2005) (2007), for Para/Site Art Space's "Hongkong Artists in the 1980s" series. More recent important essays include "Attempting a history of (new) media arts for Hong Kong: archaeology, literacy and education for artists" for the *Hong Kong Visual Arts Yearbook 2007* (2008), a first essay of its nature to trace the fragments of events that would culminate in a history of Hong Kong's media art activities.

Lai had been a juror for various editions of IFVA (Independent Film & Video Awards, Hong Kong) and the Bloomberg Emerging Artists Program, and adviser to the Museum of Art and Hong Kong Arts Development Council's Media Art sector. In her capacity as an educator and artists, Linda has worked with many young and aspiring art practitioners in Hong Kong.
